## Specialty Animal

Specialty animals are defined as dogs that are not providing a service to a person with a disability but are trained to perform professional functions. A registered certificate will be required as proof that the dog is trained, along with a valid health and vaccination certificate.

Please return the completed copy of this form with the required documents to PAL Airlines no less than 96 hours prior to your flight. If submitted within 96 hours, we will make every reasonable effort to accommodate the request.

**Incomplete or illegible documents will not be approved.**

The trainer/owner must make all arrangements and assume full responsibility for complying with any laws, customs and/or other governmental regulations, requirements, or restrictions of the country, province, state, or territory to which the animal is being transported, including but not limited to, furnishing valid health and vaccination certificates, when required. Carrier will not be responsible in the event any such specialty animal is refused entry into or passage through any country, province, state, or territory.

### Procedures for Carriage

- PAL Airlines assumes no responsibility for the care of the specialty dog while in transit. The care and supervision of the dog is solely the responsibility of the trainer/owner.
- The trainer/owner should carry a registered certificate stating that they are a certified handler of the animal, and that the animal has received appropriate training.
- The dog must be at least 4 months of age and the trainer/owner must provide a valid health and vaccination certificate.
- The dog must be fed and watered within the four (4) hour period before check in. The trainer/owner should feed the dog a light meal prior to departure and provide a quick drink of water before check in. Trainer/owner(s) must be responsible to ensure the specialty animal will not have to relieve itself of bodily fluids during the flight.
- PAL Airlines must be notified a minimum of 72 hours prior to the flight's departure to allow adequate time to assign seating on the aircraft.
- The dog will remain properly always harnessed with the trainer and remain at their foot area.
- The passenger may be required to accompany the animal through additional security screening prior to proceeding through passenger screening.
